On 26 October Salisbury Civic Society unveiled a blue plaque at St Nicholas Hospital to commemorate its history, including its connection with the Victorian novelist Anthony Trollope that made the hospital and Salisbury famous. Brother Eric represented the Trollope Society and gave a presentation to an audience of about 100 that he will deliver again at a forthcoming Circle lunch meeting, when the connection will be explained.

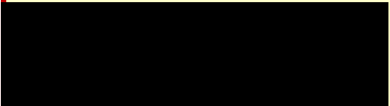
